

Two plead guilty to second-degree murder in killing of four

Two men who cut the throats of an Etobicoke tavern manager, his common-law wife and two roomers at their home last year have been allowed to plead guilty to second-degree murder.

Roy Charles Fish, 32, of Etobicoke, and Vincent Joseph McDonald, 30, of no fixed address, were convicted yesterday by Chief Justice Gregory Evans of the Ontario Supreme Court's trial division.

A third man, Millard John Lunn, 33, was convicted of kidnapping.

The three had been charged with first-degree murder, but Norman Matusiak, the Crown prosecutor, consented to the lesser charges, making a three-month murder trial involving 126 witnesses unnecessary.

Mr. Matusiak said in an interview that he consented because his case against the men was hampered by a "basic weakness in the reliability of witnesses."

He said he did not avoid a trial because it would be expensive and long. "Not when you have four people butchered," he said.

Judge Evans will sentence them on March 26. The minimum sentence for second-degree murder is life in prison without eligibility for parole for 10 years. There is no parole for first-degree murder for 25 years.

The victims were Leonard Martindale, 55, manager of the Boulevard Inn on Lake Shore Boulevard, his common-law wife, Pearl Savas, 51, a waitress at the tavern, and two boarders, Ronald MacDonald, a 48-year-old laborer, and Hugh Patengale, 58, who

was unemployed.

They were found at Mr. Martindale's home at 149 Islanding Ave. last July 26, bound and gagged with transparent tape. Their throats were slashed and they had multiple stab wounds to their heads and necks. Three had been shot in the head and all had been beaten.

Statements filed as exhibits showed that the victims' throats were slashed to make sure they were dead after being shot in the head. The two boarders died because they happened to be in the house and could identify the killers.

A butcher knife with a bloody eight-inch blade was found at the scene. Police later recovered a sawed-off rifle and a starter's pistol that had been bored to fire .22 calibre bullets in Lake Ontario, where the men had

thrown the weapons after the killings.

Mr. Matusiak told Judge Evans yesterday that the three men had initially set out to rob Mr. Martindale of money because he knew the combination to the tavern's safe and could open it.

But Mr. Fish also sought revenge against Mr. Martindale for co-operating with police when they came to the tavern one night looking for him. Mr. Martindale identified Mr. Fish and he spent seven months in jail on a charge of breaking and entering.

The day before the slayings, the three men had tried to rob a hotel on Danforth Avenue of the day's cash receipts, Mr. Matusiak told the court.

After that holdup failed, the men decided to rob Mr. Martindale. On July 26, they walked into Mr. Martindale's house and, at gun point, demanded that he go to the tavern to get money from the safe. Miss Savas was bound and gagged and the armed men threatened to shoot her if he refused.

Mr. Patengale, a boarder at the house, was grabbed by the armed men and put in the kitchen.

Mr. Lunn went with Mr. Martindale to the tavern, where Mr. Martindale opened the safe and turned over \$2,000 in cash in a bank bag. The two men returned to Mr. Martindale's home.

According to a Mr. Lunn's statement to police entered in court yesterday as an exhibit, Mr. Fish, who is called Mike by Mr. Lunn and Mr.

McDonald, made the people lie face down on the floor.

"I was in the front part of the house and I heard Mike say, 'I want to shoot Lenny (Mr. Martindale) first.'"

"So then all I heard was bullets cracking and Mike run out into the kitchen and he grabbed a knife and when he grabbed the knife I run out the door, then there was a guy come up the street and he walked in. I heard a couple more cracks, but I wasn't in the house at the time," Mr. Lunn's

statement said.

The fourth person to walk into the house — to his death — was boarder Ronald MacDonald, Mr. Matusiak said.

Mr. McDonald, a native of Windsor, Nfld., and Mr. Fish, a native of Halifax, were arrested by Royal Canadian Mounted Police in Windsor, Nfld., on Aug. 5 last year, and charged with murder.

Mr. Lunn, a native of Halifax, was arrested later by police in Toronto.

Plan for trustee aides abandoned

The Toronto Board of Education has reversed itself and decided not to hire assistants for trustees.

At its last meeting on Feb. 12, the board voted 14-10 to hire the assistants. Last night, the vote was 14-11 against the hirings.

Several trustees mentioned that constituents have expressed displeasure at the idea. If every trustee hired an assistant at \$500 a month, the cost

to the board would be \$156,000 annually.

The decision to hire was to be reviewed in six months, but the matter was reopened quickly by trustee Tom Jakobek who was unhappy with the idea.

During the debate last night, trustees favoring the hirings argued that they have heavy workloads, that the board isn't short of money and that

assistants would enable trustees to do a better job.

"Our position as trustee is considerably castrated because we don't have enough resources," Joan Doiron said.

Trustees opposing the idea said that matters a trustee handles are usually confidential, and assistants would merely create another level of bureaucracy and irritate the public.

Montemurro due in court on tax counts

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont. (CP) — Niagara Falls businessman Carlo Montemurro will appear in Provincial Court on May 19 to stand trial on five charges under the Income Tax Act.

Mr. Montemurro was a principal in three companies that collapsed last spring — Astra Trust Co., Re-Mor Investment Management Corp. and C & M Financial Consultants Ltd. — leaving hundreds of investors with huge financial losses.

He has since been charged with theft, fraud and conspiracy involving \$3.8-million in relation to C & M's collapse.

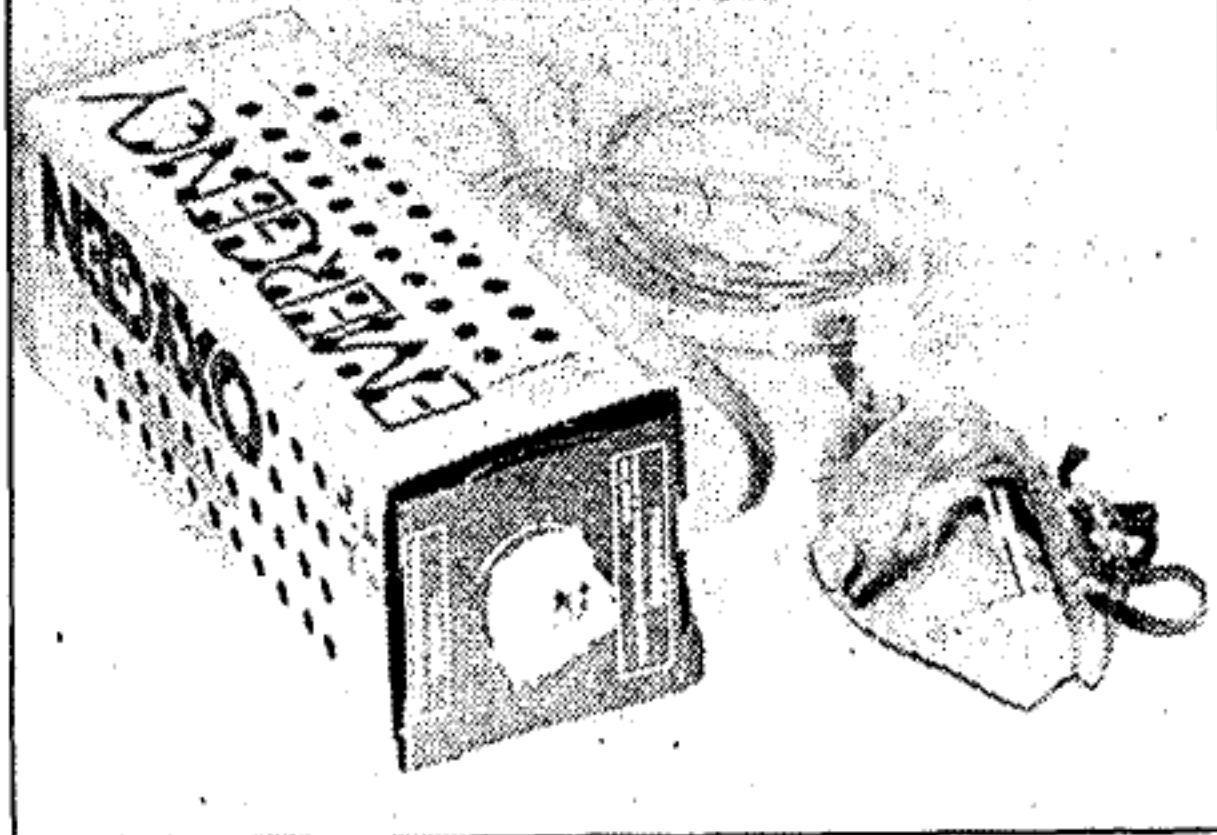

Portable emergency oxygen kit being distributed in Canada.

Oxygen kits ineffective, health officials warn

Federal health officials have issued a warning about ineffective portable emergency oxygen kits banned in the United States but still being distributed in Canada.

"When things get banned in the United States it is surprising how many show up here," said Arjit DasGupta, director of the bureau of medical devices of the federal health protection branch of the Department of National Health and Welfare.

Dr. DasGupta said the kits do not provide enough oxygen to be of any use to a sick person. Two of 20 tested did not produce any oxygen at all.

He said he is concerned because the kits may be relied on for emergency aid by ski resorts, factory first-aid rooms or by individual patients with asthma or emphysema.

Dr. DasGupta said the kits, called emergency oxygen generators, are about 18 inches long and 4 inches wide. They were made by Green Cross Solid State Oxygen Inc. of Dania, Fla., which is no longer in business.

Dr. DasGupta said after being alerted by Telex from U.S. health authorities he tested 20 of the kits obtained from the Canadian distributors "and we found they didn't work."

He said known Canadian distributors are Safety House of Canada Ltd. and Rival Manufacturing Co. of Canada Ltd.

However, Rival Manufacturing said it sold all its remaining stock to Safety House about 18 months ago.

The Medical Post, in its current issue, quotes G. J. Yaffe, president of Safety House, as saying that his company has stopped selling the kits "and anyone who wants to return them can, but we are waiting on the reports from Ottawa before sending out any information to owners."

Mr. Yaffe, who could not be reached yesterday, is quoted in the Medical Post as saying that the Government had not yet supplied details of the tests they had carried out.

He told the Medical Post that the two units of the 20 tested that are said to have failed completely might have been improperly operated, since the device is not designed to work in a vertical position.

Dr. DasGupta laughed when this was read to him over the telephone. "It doesn't work in any position," he said.

Dr. DasGupta said the bureau has no idea how many of the kits are in Canada — "it could be in the thousands."

He said when a device found to be faulty is located in hospitals or in doctors' offices, the bureau has efficient methods of direct communication, but when unknown numbers have been sold over the counter the bureau's only recourse is to alert the public through the media.

8-foot-2 man listed as tallest in world

LAKE VILLA, Ill. (AP) — Don Koehler, listed in the Guinness Book of Records as the world's tallest man, died Wednesday at his home. He he was recuperating from a heart ailment, relatives said.

The 8-foot-2 Mr. Koehler, 55, was relatively slender and weighed 300 pounds. He retired three years ago after 25 years as a salesman for Big Joe Manufacturing Co. of Lincolnwood, makers of hydraulic lifts.

He used ordinary-sized furniture except for an eight-foot bed, explaining that he believed "when in Rome, do as the Romans do."

His shoes were size 22. He said he had a problem with socks until a Pennsylvania firm heard about it and made them to order for him.

A funeral service was held Tuesday for Dr. Wilbert Torrance McBroom, a family doctor in Toronto for more than 60 years, who died Sunday at 95.

He was the oldest living alumnus of the University of Western Ontario medical school, from which he graduated in 1907.

After graduation he was in practice briefly in Oil Springs and Collingwood, Ont., and in Toronto was on the staff of St. Joseph's Hospital for many years.

He leaves his wife, Helen; 55, a daughter, Mrs. F. J. Beharrell of Schenectady, N.Y., and a son, Dr. George L. McBroom of Mississauga.

Pilot is killed as jet crashes in Quebec

MONTREAL (CP) — The pilot of a Canadian Armed Forces CF-5 jet fighter was killed yesterday when the aircraft crashed near Portneuf Lake, about 275 kilometres north of Quebec, during a routine training flight.

The pilot was identified as Capt. Germain Boutin, 28, of Notre Dame de la Dore, Que. He leaves his wife and a daughter.

His body was recovered shortly after the accident by a helicopter sent from Bagotville, 100 kilometres away.
